Simlipal National Park

 Mayurbhanj District |  Established: 1980
 Area: 845.70 sq km | UNESCO Biosphere Reserve


Wildlife: Royal Bengal Tigers, Elephants, Leopards, Gaur, Sambar, Barking Deer

Features: Famous for melanistic (black) tigers, Barehipani & Joranda waterfalls, scenic beauty




Flora: Sal forests dominate, 1,078 plant species including rare orchids and medicinal plants

Bhitarkanika National Park

 Kendrapara District |  Established: 1998
 Area: 145 sq km | Mangrove Ecosystem

Wildlife: Saltwater Crocodiles (largest in India), King Cobras, White Crocodiles, Water Monitor Lizards

Features: Second largest mangrove ecosystem in India, intricate network of creeks and mudflats


Birds: Over 215 bird species including migratory birds, Olive Ridley sea turtle nesting nearby

Notable Wildlife Sanctuaries

Chilika Lake Wildlife Sanctuary

 Puri, Khordha, Ganjam Districts


- Asia's largest brackish water lagoon
- Famous for Irrawaddy dolphins
- Over 1 million migratory birds annually
- Ramsar Wetland Site of International Importance
- Important stopover for birds on Central Asian Flyway

Satkosia Gorge Wildlife Sanctuary

 Angul, Cuttack, Nayagarh, Boudh


- Tiger Reserve along Mahanadi River
- 22 km long scenic gorge formation
- Ghariales, mugger crocodiles present
- Elephants, leopards, sambar deer
- Rich in avifauna and reptile diversity

Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary

 Bargarh District

- Located near Hirakud Reservoir
- Leopards, elephants, sambar deer
- Four-horned antelope, sloth bears
- Rich birdlife including migratory species
- Dense deciduous forests

Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary

 Kendrapara District

- World's largest Olive Ridley rookery
- Mass nesting phenomenon (arribada)
- Protected marine sanctuary zone
- Lakhs of turtles nest here annually
- Critical for turtle conservation
